

Activity Blocks allows campers to participate as their tipi/yurt group the above listed programs. Campers will have these times to develop teamwork, build friendships and create memories together at these program areas.

Section Activity is a time for campers to gather with all groups in their age group. An activity will be facilitated during this time which could be a sing-a-long campfire or a large game such as capture the flag. It's a time to gather and connect with other campers their age to expand their community.

Freebies are a time where your camper is able to sign up to attend a program area they enjoyed the most so they can experience it again! They will join other campers with the same interest and get to focus on what they loved to do the most.

6 DAY OVERNIGHT PROGRAMS

Chiniquay [7-9 years]

Accommodations: Cabin or Tipi

Chiniquay campers come for 6 days, 5 nights, and stay in either tipi or cabin accommodations located at Bowfort Lodge. They will experience many camp activities that include archery, rock climbing, games, canoeing, and get to visit the horses. Chiniquay campers will also participate in an introduction to overnight camping and spend a night onsite in a tent. All Chiniquay campers will develop their teamwork skills, experience new challenges and meet new friends. Chiniquay campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023





Mistaya [10-11 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Mistaya camp offers a time for learning, making friends, working as a team, and having fun outdoors! During this 6-day program, campers will participate in a day hike, canoeing, arts and crafts, climbing, and an overnight excursion in a tent or shelter on site. All Mistaya camps are run out of Hector Lodge and campers will stay in yurts. This program is an introductory level program for those campers new to camp between the ages of 10-11 years.

Mistaya campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023

Kananaskin [12-13 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Kananaskin camp offers a time for learning, making friends, working as a team, and having fun outdoors! During this 6-day program, campers will participate in a day hike, canoeing, arts and crafts, climbing, and an overnight excursion in a tent or shelter on site. All Kananaskin camps are run out of Hector Lodge and campers will stay in yurts This program is an introductory level program for those campers new to camp between the ages of 12 - 13 years.

Kananaskin campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023



13 DAY OVERNIGHT PROGRAMS

Mistaya [10-11 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Mistaya campers come to camp for a 13-day session and live in yurts near Hector Lodge. Campers will participate in various traditional camp activities including archery, rock climbing, and canoeing while developing their teamwork and self-confidence. Each camper will get the opportunity to visit and learn about the horses. Each Mistaya camper will experience a 3-day overnight hike at a local campsite. During this adventure, campers will help pack and carry their gear and food, help set up their campsite and work as a team to learn and have fun.

Mistaya campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023





Kananaskin [12-13 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Kananaskin campers come to camp for a 13-day session and live in yurts near Hector Lodge. Campers participate in various traditional camp activities including archery, rock climbing, and canoeing while building their team, and developing their personal skills. Each camper will have the opportunity to visit the horses. These campers will prepare for their 4-day overnight hike by first doing a day hike and camp overnight onsite. During the hiking adventures, campers will help pack and carry their gear and food, help set up their campsite and work as a team to learn and have fun.

Kananaskin campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023


13 DAY OVERNIGHT PROGRAMS

Pioneer- Canoe Focus [14-15 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Pioneer canoe campers come to camp for a 13-day session and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Campers will learn about teamwork, leadership, responsibility, and develop personal strengths and self-confidence. Campers will participate in a variety of camp activities such as games, arts and crafts, archery, climbing and more. These campers will participate in 9 days (total) of canoeing. These 9 days are broken down into a day trip, an overnight, and the longer backcountry expedition. These experiences give opportunities for campers to focus on developing leadership and outdoor living skills, as well as backcountry travel. **Pioneer campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023**





Pioneer- Hike Focus [14-15 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Pioneer hike campers come to camp for a 13-day session and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Campers will learn about teamwork, leadership, responsibility, and develop personal strengths and self-confidence. Campers will participate in a variety of camp activities such as games, arts and crafts, archery, climbing and more. These campers will participate in 9 days (total) of hiking. These 9 days are broken down into a day trip, an overnight, and the longer backcountry expedition. These experiences give opportunities for campers to focus on developing leadership and outdoor living skills, as well as backcountry travel.

Pioneer campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023

HORSE BASED PROGRAMS

Wrangler in Training -Level 1 [14-16 years] Accommodations: Yurt

Our Wrangler in Training Program is an equine and leadership focused program. In this two week program, campers will spend the majority of their time involved in activities at the barn where they will gain a rich experience with horses involving developing horsemanship and horseback riding skills. Campers will also participate in camp activities, a day hike, and games. They will experience daily life at the barn and have leadership opportunities with the younger groups onsite. Wranglers in Training 1 is suitable for campers that have no or some horse experience.

Wrangler in Training -

Level 2 [14-16 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Our Wrangler in Training Program is an equine and leadership focused program. In this two week program, campers will spend the majority of their time involved in activities at the barn where they will gain a rich experience with horses involving developing horsemanship and horseback riding skills. Campers will also participate in camp activities, a day hike, and games. They will experience daily life at the barn and have leadership opportunities with the younger groups onsite. Wranglers in Training II is suitable for campers that have been through the Wrangler in Training program, or have past experience with horseback riding and are able to comfortably ride including trotting.

All wrangler in Training campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023







LEADERSHIP BASED PROGRAMS

Leadership - Hike Focus [16 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Leadership campers come to camp for 27 days and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Their focus will be on learning and developing backcountry expedition skills and leadership abilities. To facilitate their development in these areas, campers will participate in various outdoor expedition trips, including onsite overnights and day trips. Included in this program is over 16 nights of backcountry hiking trip experience. Groups plan and prepare together for their exciting and rewarding expedition trips with their leaders. Throughout their month-long experience, they will develop personal strengths and new abilities. Leadership campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023





Leadership - Canoe Focus [16 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Leadership campers come to camp for 27 days and stay in yurts near Deer Lodge (Mid-camp). Their focus will be on learning and developing backcountry expedition skills and leadership abilities. To facilitate their development in these areas, campers will participate in various outdoor expedition trips, including onsite overnights and canoe practice training prior to the expedition. Included in this program is over 16 nights of backcountry canoe tripping experience. Groups plan and prepare together for their exciting and rewarding expedition trips with their leaders. Throughout their month-long experience, they will develop personal strengths and new abilities.

Leadership campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023

LEADERSHIP BASED PROGRAMS

Leaders in Training [17 years]

Accommodations: Yurt

Registration for the Leaders-in-Training (LIT) program involves an application and interview process that is open to past Leadership participants and other interested youths. LIT is a month-long program during which they will participate in leadership training, a backpacking trip, and activities to develop their leadership skills. The second two weeks is reserved for the LIT's to volunteer as a counsellor for a Chiniquay or Mistaya group. This program is focused on building leadership skills and gaining experience being a counsellor. This program includes a 3 day offsite expedition aimed to build outdoor leadership skills

Leader in Training campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023

Sac Dene Canoe Program [17 years] Accommodations: Yurt

Sac Dene campers come to camp for 55 days and live in a Yurt near Deer Lodge. The focus of this program is on honing outdoor leadership skills on a 40-day wilderness canoe trip. Sac dene Campers will be immersed in a team environment, allowing them to explore the ways in which they can contribute to a common goal and group identity. Campers will become a part of the planning and preparation process for the wilderness expedition by contributing toward food and gear packing as well as developing individual and group goals for the expedition. On the wilderness expedition, campers will have the opportunity to hone their skills as outdoor leaders by taking on peer-leadership roles, such as navigation, route planning, camp craft, and cooking. Throughout the Sac Dene program, campers will develop their personal strengths, learn new skills, and recognize areas of growth.

Sac Dene campers must turn this age by December 31st, 2023



DAY CAMP

Day Camp Program [6-9 years]

Lunch is provided.

Day Camp sessions run 5 days, Monday to Friday. Campers receive a lunch each day to fuel them as they participate in many traditional camp activities including archery, games, canoeing, climbing, and pony petting. Day campers work as a team to experience new activities and face challenges with the guidance of their counsellor. Bussing is available from CANMORE and EXSHAW for no additional cost. Our site is located in the Bow Valley - approximately 55 min west of Calgary.

Transportation for day camp is either by personal vehicle or by bus from Canmore and Exshaw.

There is no bus transportation from Calgary for our Day Camp program.

DEPOSIT AND PAYMENT INFORMATION

A 25% deposit of total registration fees is required at time of registration to secure your spot. During registration you can choose to pay in full, or select payment installments. Installment payments are spread out over 3 payments and begin on March 1st, 2023.



TRANSPORTATION FOR CAMP

Camp Chief Hector YMCA has two options for campers to get to and from camp for their overnight program. They can catch a bus at Shane Homes at Rocky Ridge YMCA or can be dropped off by personal vehicle to site. The bus option does not have a fee associated with it.

CANCELLATION POLICY

- Cancellations less than 60 days before the program start date are charged a 25% cancellation fee
- Cancellations less than 14 days before the program start date will be charged the full camp fee
- Medical cancellations will receive a refund with a valid note from your primary health care provider
- Cancellations due to illness, on the first day of program or after, will be pro-rated refund from the time of the cancellation
- Refunds will not be issued where a camper is removed from the camp program at the choice or request of the camper or parent(s)/guardian(s), or because of not following the camper code of conduct for behaviour or camp rules
- Should we not be able to offer day camps safely under government restrictions, refunds and payment options will be provided
- Cancellations prior to 60 days before the first date of the session receive a full refund with no fee or penalty
